BIBLE STUDY METHOD

Cross reference scriptures of similar topic to get an overview of the passage. Who is the author addressing? What is the cultural context? Who is the passage about?

A: APPLICATION: How do you apply this little truth to your life? Are there any areas in your life that do not align with the scripture and need to change? Have you seen growth in any areas?

P: PRAYER: Write a prayer asking how to implement this verse in your life. Pray for others who may be dealing with a similar issue. Praise God for his blessings and opening your eyes to his truths.

Understanding the foundation



Welcome to Day 1 of your 21-day prayer journey! Today, we will explore what prayer is and why it's so important. At its core, prayer is simply communication with God. It is a way for us to connect with our Creator, share our hearts, and align ourselves with His will.

The basics of prayer



Welcome to Day 3! Today, we'll focus on the practical aspect of prayer: how to pray. Prayer is meant to be personal and genuine, and there are no right or wrong ways to talk to God. It's about building that connection, just like implementing a new process or system in a company—prayer brings clarity, focus, and alignment with God's will.

In Matthew 6:9-13, Jesus gives us a framework for prayer, known as the Lord's Prayer. This simple yet profound model includes adoration ("Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name"), petition ("Give us this day our daily bread"), and requests for forgiveness and protection. Just as you would make a strategic shift in business to focus on the core of what matters most, fasting sharpens your focus on God and His will for your life. It's not about what we give up, but about what we gain: a deeper connection with God, clarity in our prayers, and spiritual breakthrough.

"When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full." — Matthew 6:16

Gratitude as a key component of prayer
